On Sunday afternoon, the team travelled across London to Chingford in Essex to face Eastside Eagles in the 3rd Round of the National Shield. Eastside Eagles were undefeated in seven matches and were confident that this would be the eighth. However, the Richmond Men had other ideas.

It was an extremely good match right from the start with both teams sinking their shots, getting their rebounds and playing well at both ends of the court. At the end of the first quarter Richmond were in the lead by 24:21 and were marginally the stronger team. The Men from Essex were suffering a mild degree of surprise at the strength of their opposition and the Richmond Men took advantage of this to end the first half up by 40:34.

After the break, Eastside Eagles began to change their defence and put pressure on the Richmond team. However, they reckoned without the experience of the two Richmond men, Andy Harper and Rich Wellings, for whom such intense play was nothing new. Rich Wellings in particular showed the experience of a man perfectly calm under pressure as he sank 5 out of 7 three-point shots to ensure that Richmond never once lost their upper hand. U18 player, Ed Lawrence had his best game so far this season as all 6ft 11ins of him dominated the Richmond defence under the basket.

The scores remained perilously close throughout the whole of the second half, but the Richmond Men never once let their guard slip and Eastside Eagles never once took the lead. In the end London United-Richmond College were the worthy winners with a scoreline of 76:72. They now progress through to the Quarter Final of the National Shield.
