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HRUC's Ofsted Report: A Place to Enjoy Learning, Develop and Succeed

HRUC (Harrow, Richmond, and Uxbridge Colleges), one of the leading further education institutions in London, has been rated "Strong for Skills", and "Outstanding" for the behaviour and attitudes and personal development of its students, in its latest Ofsted inspection. HRUC achieved an overall "Good" rating for its educational offerings, leadership, and management.



The inspection, which took place in November 2024 across HRUC's five campuses, highlights the strong performance across several areas, and its positive impact on students, employers, and the local community.

We are proud of our record breaking, best ever results across all three colleges. Our performance has seen our 16-18 year old achievement rates reach 87% - outstripping the national average of 80%. In addition, we're delighted that all 15 subjects delivered across the HRUC group are also outperforming the national average.

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Deputy Mayor of London for Business & Growth Visits RuTC

We were thrilled to welcome the Deputy Mayor of London for Business & Growth, Howard Dawber, Leader of Richmond Council, Councillor Gareth Roberts and Lead Member for Business and Growth, Councillor Phil Giesler to our Richmond upon Thames College (RuTC) campus in January.

The visit was in the context of noting the transformational impact of the Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan's funding to redevelop our college site through their Skills for Londoners programme. Over 13,000 learners have benefitted from this investment so far, with the number expected to rise to 36,000 by 2031.

Guests were given a tour of our impressive college buildings and facilities, including our new STEM Centre and Immersive Room, giving them the chance to speak with some of our current students about their courses, experiences and aspirations.



Ahead of the forthcoming London Growth Plan in February, the visit was also designed to help highlight economic priorities in the borough, to allow the Greater London Authority to continue their excellent support.



Our new 'Be Extraordinary' student campaign, showcases some of our extraordinary students at HRUC and their achievements.


Jack
